

A soaring star. Take this one straight to the pool room. It combines meatiness and savouriness with flair. It's an exquisite example of the beauty of a perfectly ripened medium-weight wine; it makes excess density look crass and unnecessary. Plums, cured meats, peppers and cloves. If you were listing it at a restaurant it would be as at home under the food heading as it is under wine. One out of the box.

2013 Command Shiraz

Single Vineyard Shiraz available March 2017



The oak and the fruit have fast become inseparable. Rich blackberry, coal, earth and coffee-cream flavours cascade onto the palate and on out through the finish. Dry, filigreed tannin builds as the wine breathes; you'll only notice it once you're safe in its embrace. Both old school and new school at once; it's elegant and rich, unafraid of oak but blessed with pure, dark-berried fruit.



2014 Western Ridge Shiraz

Elegance is in vogue at Elderton. We're talking poised, well-ripened, letthe-clubhead-do-the-work wines, where the fruit has time and space to display more than mere sweetness or, indeed, brute strength. This show notes of coffee grounds, black pepper, blackberried fruit and cured meats, and closes the deal with a run of finely crafted tannin.

2014 Ashmead Cabernet Sauvignon

Ripe fruits are rolled into a ball and the shutters haven't yet come up, but the tannin is firm, and everything seems trained to evolve slowly. Classy oak offers flavours of chocolate and sawdust; the fruit rings with blackcurrant and boysenberry. Performance will be excellent, given time.

2014 Barossa Shiraz

This would blow your hair back. It offers a whoosh of syrupy soft flavour. It's all plums and cloves and smoky oat; twist the top and the scents and flavours are at you at a rate of knots, as if they have please to sell and the faster the deal is sealed, the better. It will cellar, but there's no need to.

2014 Western Ridge Grenache Carignan

Light colour, bell-clear flavours, dried spice and redcurrant, tangy acidity that sits as one with the fruit and tannin. Oak is a minor player at most. Top-notch example of a lighter Barossan style.
